They behaved impeccably throughout the day and evening and were a big credit to Penair School.

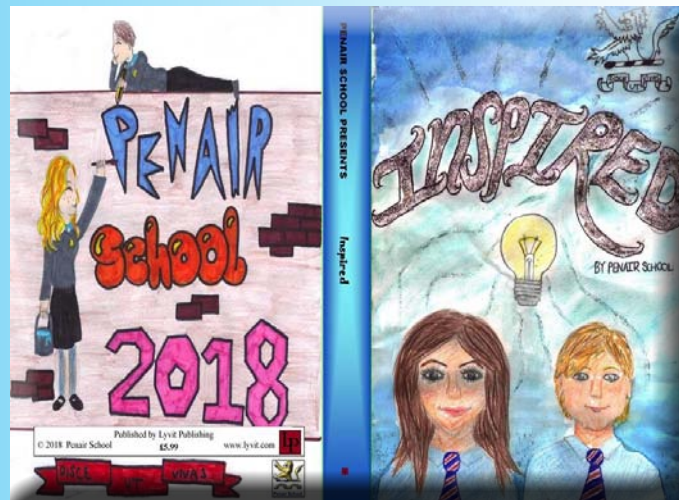


CREATIVE CLUB
